The station beginning the authentication process will “challenge” the other station by selecting from the tables in this document:

- A table letter or the appropriate table for the time period.
Note: When multiple tables are in use, the table letter representing a specific Table is selected. When tables are assigned by date/time period the table assigned to the date/time period is selected and no Table Letter is selected.
- Select two random letters from the table, consisting of
 - a. A random letter (except Z) from LINE INDICATOR COLUMN of the selected table selecting a Line
 - b. a random letter from the selected Line

The station will make a radio call in accordance with ACP-125 (G) section 619.

EXAMPLE – **“ALPHA ALPHA ALPHA THIS IS BRAVO BRAVO BRAVO, AUTHENTICATE BRAVO UNIFORM, OVER”**

3. The challenged station will “reply” with the cipher letter directly *below* the second letter in the challenge.

EXAMPLE – **“THIS IS ALPHA ALPHA ALPHA, I AUTHENTICATE INDIA, OVER”**

If the station that began the authentication process has not already been authenticated, the second station will then challenge the first station using the same procedure with a different random letter combination from the same table.

AUTOMATED PROCESS USING STATION MASTER

<Bring up Station Manager and select ctrl + T to bring up the Auth Table>

STANDARDS

To achieve this standard printed copies of the Authentication Tables should be readily available when operating.

- Within 15 seconds (not counting time taken by the other radio station), transmit using proper radio procedure, a two letter challenge, and from the reply, determine whether or not the station responded correctly.
- Within 15 seconds, using the correct radio procedure, respond to a challenge with correct authentication. If immediately challenged again, respond correctly within 5 seconds.

FAILURE TO AUTHENTICATE

Another challenge should be made if an incorrect reply is received, if a "standby" is requested, or if an unusual delay occurs between challenge and reply.

Failing to properly reply to a challenge three times shall be considered a failure to authenticate. Stations who fail to authenticate shall not be authorized net entry or the listing of traffic.

During **training** use, a failure to properly authenticate may be handled by telephone or e-mail to quickly get the offending station back into the net.

A station that is unable to authenticate with this publication, but that can communicate with MARS stations using an appropriate on-line or off-line encryption systems shall be considered properly authenticated.
